In Jewish tradition, honey cake, also known as lekach, is a staple of the Rosh Hashanah (Jewish New Year) meal, where it symbolizes a wish for a sweet and prosperous year ahead. The custom is particularly strong within Ashkenazi Jewish culture, where the recipe has a long history.

The most significant early association was with the

initiation of new students into Jewish schooling (cheder). Children were given a slate with Hebrew letters, which were covered in honey to be licked off, associating the study of letters with sweetness. Honey cake was then served to celebrate the new scholar.

Honey cakes existed in various cultures before becoming prominent in Jewish tradition, but the term "lekach" first appeared in German Jewish sources around the Medieval period.

As a central part of the Rosh Hashanah meal, the honey cake represents the hope for a life filled with sweetness and blessings in the coming year. This is further reinforced by the holiday tradition of dipping apples into honey, another gesture for a sweet new year.

Let us celebrate the coming year 5786 with sweetness, prosperity, health, and the return of our hostages...BRING THEM HOME!

rom the Rabbi's Desk



This September overlaps with the Hebrew month of Elul. If one counts from the previous Rosh Hashana, Elul is the twelfth and last month of the year. As we prepare to greet this year of 5786, it is a time of reflection and introspection. The year has had many highs and, of course, its lows. Some will be happy to move to another year, and some will be sorry to see this last year go. We have a month to prepare for the

High Holidays, our sage gave us hints to direct our focus when this time of year rolls around.

The famous Arizal notes that the Hebrew letters of the word Elul correspond to several scriptural verses. In Shemos we are told, "But for one who has not lain in Ambush and G-d has caused it to come to his hand, I shall provide you a place to which he shall flee." In this verse in Hebrew, the first letters spell out the word Elul. This teaches us that even though the year may have had its challenges, as we greet a new year and reach the month of Elul, we find our refuge in Hashem. There is an additional verse in Devarim that has the letters of the word Elul. The verse states, "Hashem, your G-d, will Circumcise your heart and the heart of your offspring." This verse highlights the need for us to be vulnerable and peel back some of our stubborn hearts, which often prevent us from doing what we know is right. The last verse I would like to point to is from the Song of Songs. Here, the verse says, "I am to my beloved and my beloved is to me." Here too, the verse in Hebrew starts with the letter of the word Elul. This most famous verse reminds us that at this time of year, Hashem is waiting to establish a close connection with us, and we should yearn for this connection from Him.

Ultimately, these verses, as well as others, teach us that this last month of the year is a very auspicious time for closeness to G-d. As we replay the year in our heads, we should get ready for another special year. May this time of introspection be meaningful, and may we greet the following year with joy. As the blessings go, may the best day of this year be the worst day of next year.
